## Welcome to 6th Grade Choir!

It looks like this will be another unique year with more questions than answers, regarding things related to planning. My theme as we begin is, "Make Plans, but Be Flexible!" As a teacher who has been directing choirs for more than 30 years, I learned a lot of new (digital) methods last year. I often struggle with technology, but students have been very helpful and together we can learn a lot! One thing I am sure of: I will never again take for granted, the joy of singing together! When we couldn't make music together it was frustrating. All the technology in the world can't replace the joy of a group of people, each giving something of themselves to create something that none of them could have done alone.

Our 6th Grade Choir is an important part of the Choir Program here at Lakeshore! The Elementary Choir is the foundation of our program, giving students the opportunity to sing, perform, and learn some music reading basics. The Middle School Choirs build on that foundation with more: choir classes, reading/writing music, voice training, performances, and special opportunities to grow and develop your abilities. There is much to learn in just a few short years to prepare you for even more musical experiences in our High School Choirs! In this handbook you will find a lot of information about our choir. The $6{ }^{\text {th }}$ Grade Choir functions as a class and the expectations are different from those of the Elementary Choir. Please read this handbook carefully so that you know what you can expect, and what is expected of you! At the end of the handbook there are pages to return. Please turn them in by September $3^{\text {rd }}$.

Please keep informed about our choirs through: the Choir Website, PowerSchool Email, and Google Classroom. The website is a great resource for parents and students. You will find updates, parent notes, announcements, celebrations, pictures, schedules, and meeting dates. Please check it out at: lakeshoremschoirs.weebly.com. PowerSchool email allows me to quickly get updates and reminders to parents. This is an important part of staying flexible with our plans as I may need to notify parents quickly. If you have not registered your email address(es) in the PowerSchool system please contact the Middle School Office for help in getting that set up. We will use Google Classroom in choir quite a bit and I will walk students through it in class. Thank you for helping with communication in these ways!

If after reading the Handbook (or at any other time!), you have questions or comments, please contact me! I'm looking forward to working with you this year and having a great year in choir! The power in singing together is more than the musical harmony we create. It's about the harmony of people coming together. This year we will create harmony in new ways!

Behavioral Expectations: It is expected that students will treat other class members, teachers, substitute teachers, and student leaders with respect. Student behavior that is detrimental to the group may result in the removal (temporarily or permanently) from the choir.

Singing Expectations: Some students are very comfortable with the sound of their voice and they don't mind others hearing them (some actually love to be heard!). Other students, especially at this age, are not comfortable singing alone, or in front of people. Whichever group you are in - relax! I will not ask you to sing alone (though I will give plenty of opportunities for you to do so!). The point of choir is not solo singing, it's coming together to create music in a way we can't do on our own.

Choir Parents: All parents of Lakeshore Choir students (grades 6-12) are members of the Lakeshore Choir Parents Organization. This group meets monthly and helps with fundraising, publicity, handling of choir money, scholarships, and more. Parents are invited, and encouraged, to attend these monthly meetings! Check the choir website for details.

## Grades:

- $35 \%$ Participation - Students are expected to sing, listen, and join in class discussions at the appropriate times. They are also expected to have their materials ready when class begins. Additionally, there is a zero-tolerance policy for teasing. Singing is a vulnerable activity for most of us and we will always encourage the best from each other!
- $35 \%$ Concerts \& Auditorium Rehearsals - Students are expected at these required events on time, in uniform (for concerts). Behavior and attitude also contribute to this total. Choral Festival is also considered a "concert" performance. Please note the "Concert and Auditorium Rehearsal Attendance" section from this handbook.
- $30 \%$ Classwork - There will be some digital work (on Chromebooks) and written work (paper/pencil) as we work on reading and writing music. There will also be group work done in class, as well as Learning Checks (Quizzes).

Supplies: Students need to have a pencil. A pocket folder and music will be provided by the school (music needs to be returned in good condition). We will also use the Chromebooks a lot, so they need to be charged and ready.

Uniforms: For performances, choir members wear a black choir T-shirt purchased through the school, (see back page of this Handbook for an order form), black pants, black shoes (closed toes, no high heels please). If purchasing these pieces presents a hardship, please contact Mrs. Conrad (early!). We have some donated items and our Choir Parents Organization will provide uniform pieces when needed. At our concerts, we try very hard to look "uniform" so that the audience's attention is drawn to the high-quality music we are making (not to the sparkly, red sequined headband, green hair, or unique jewelry). Individual expression is important, but not appropriate when "in uniform". Hair should not be in the singer's face. Hair accessories should match hair color. Jewelry: small earrings and rings are allowed, but no necklaces or bracelets, please.

Concert and Auditorium Rehearsal Attendance: We hope to be able to have concerts together this year! If so, we will need to be able to rely on each other to put performances together. All choir students are expected and required to be at all concerts and auditorium rehearsals (auditorium rehearsals are the rehearsals in the auditorium the day before a concert). Festival performances are also considered "concerts" in this policy. Choir is a "team effort" and we rely on the responsibility of those around us. Students and families are asked to plan around concerts and auditorium rehearsals. The Lakeshore Performing Arts Policy for Middle and High School choirs and bands applies to this choir. According to this policy, there are two kinds of absences: excused and unexcused.

Excused absences: personal illness, death in the family, and those given at the discretion of the director when notified in advance by the parent/guardian. Students with schedule conflicts in sports and other school organizations need to make the director and coach of both events aware of the conflict as soon as possible so that an agreeable plan can be reached in advance. In the case of excused absences, students can "make up" the time missed through Musical Community Service. Musical Community Service can be arranged through the director and may include: sorting music in the music library, helping with an Elementary Choir rehearsal, updating choir folders, or assisting with music for a church or community group. A form will be provided by the director.
Unexcused Absences: An absence which is not excused will result in a zero for the event. Since performances are a large part of what choirs do, they are also a large part of the choir grade. Unexcused absences for performances or auditorium rehearsals may result in the student being dropped from the choir program.

Fundraising: Last year we were not able to have any fundraisers. Our choir program has extra expenses, and we hope to be able to have fundraisers to help defray those costs this year. The money goes toward: music, supplies, reward parties, travel expenses, scholarships, etc..., and some will go toward individual student accounts.

Individual Student Accounts: Every choir student has the opportunity to let their fundraising money work directly for them through student accounts. Usually, these accounts are started in the $6^{\text {th }}$ Grade Choir. Our $7^{\text {th }} \& 8^{\text {th }}$ Graders can continue to add to them through fundraising. The money can be used for the Chicago Trip (we can't plan one yet), solo \& ensemble fees, and festival medals. This money rolls over to following years and can be used for choir related expenses even in high school! Students who leave the choir program forfeit their account and the money goes into the general choir fund. Please note, each student does not have a savings account in his or her name, but rather through careful bookkeeping the Choir Parent Treasurer keeps track of that which is specifically designated for individual student accounts. The effort is made so that those who work the hardest at fundraising, have the most benefit.

## MUSIC WITH A SACRED TEXT

The Michigan School Vocal Music Association believes that the use of good music with sacred texts is vital to choral music education and to the choral art. MSVMA supports and has adopted the position statement of the American Choral Directors Association in regard to this issue. The following statement is printed with the permission of the ACDA:

Choral music educators recognize that choral music may fulfill diverse objectives. At one end of the spectrum are aesthetic education and artistic performance that can insure development of musicality and sensitivity. At the opposite end of the spectrum is pure entertainment. Between these two poles may be found opportunities to enhance knowledge and understanding through a growing awareness and perspective of history and art as reflected in great music. To achieve any selected educational objective, the quality of repertoire is of paramount importance.

An assessment of the quality of repertoire which can fulfill the highest objectives of aesthetic education necessitates careful examination of the relationship of text and musical setting. The wealth of choral literature which represents and reflects peoples, cultures, and traditions of all lands and compositional styles of all eras includes much music in which the composer has utilized a sacred text. The term "sacred" refers to all manner of religious belief and not only to the practices of the Judeo-Christian teachings. It is important that almost all of the significant choral music composed before the 17th century was associated with a sacred text.

To study and perform music in which the musical setting of a text is artistically accomplished is a highly commendable objective. While public school teaching objectives and criteria for repertoire selection should not include religious indoctrination, the selection of quality repertoire will invariably include within its broad scope music with a sacred text. To exclude from a public school curriculum all choral music which has religious meaning associated with the text is to severely limit the possibilities of teaching for artistic understanding and responsiveness. Such an exclusion has as its parallel the study of art without any paintings related to the various religions of the world, the study of literature without mention of the Bible, or the study of architecture without reference to the great temples and cathedrals of the world.

Since choral music with a sacred text comprises such a substantial portion of the artistic repertoire representative of the choral medium and the history of music, it should have an important place in music education. Its study and artistic performance have nothing to do with the First Amendment to the Constitution and the doctrine which advocates separation of Church and State.
